**Connected and Maintained Network** building and maintaining roads and systems that safely and efficiently move people and goods and protect the environment.





**Strong and Diverse Economy** generating revenue to fund city services through the many places to live, eat, shop, work, play and access services.

## WHERE DOES THE CITY'S GENERAL FUND COME FROM?

The two largest revenue sources are property tax and sales tax, which are collectively estimated to account for 81% of 2025 General Fund recurring revenues.

### \$14.1M Property Tax




The City receives 8.4% of the total property tax collected. The 2025 levy is **estimated at \$14,081,000**, which does not include the potential annual increase allowed by state law. The City Council once again voted not to take the annual 1% increase allowed by state law, as they have done for the past 16 years.

### \$33.0M General Sales Tax



The City receives less than one percent (0.85%) of the **8.9% of sales tax paid** on purchases in Spokane Valley.
